

# Treasuring Christ in the Old Testament

As we read the Old Testament, we seek to see and treasure Christ. The following framework loosely follows an inductive study format (first *observing* the passage, then *interpreting* the passage, and finally *applying* the passage to our own lives). The goal of this worksheet is to train our minds to engage with the Old Testament for the purpose of treasuring Christ with all our hearts. After a few days of using this template, try working through this structure in a notebook or in the margin of your Bible as you engage with the text on your own, asking the Author of the Word to open your eyes to see Jesus.
